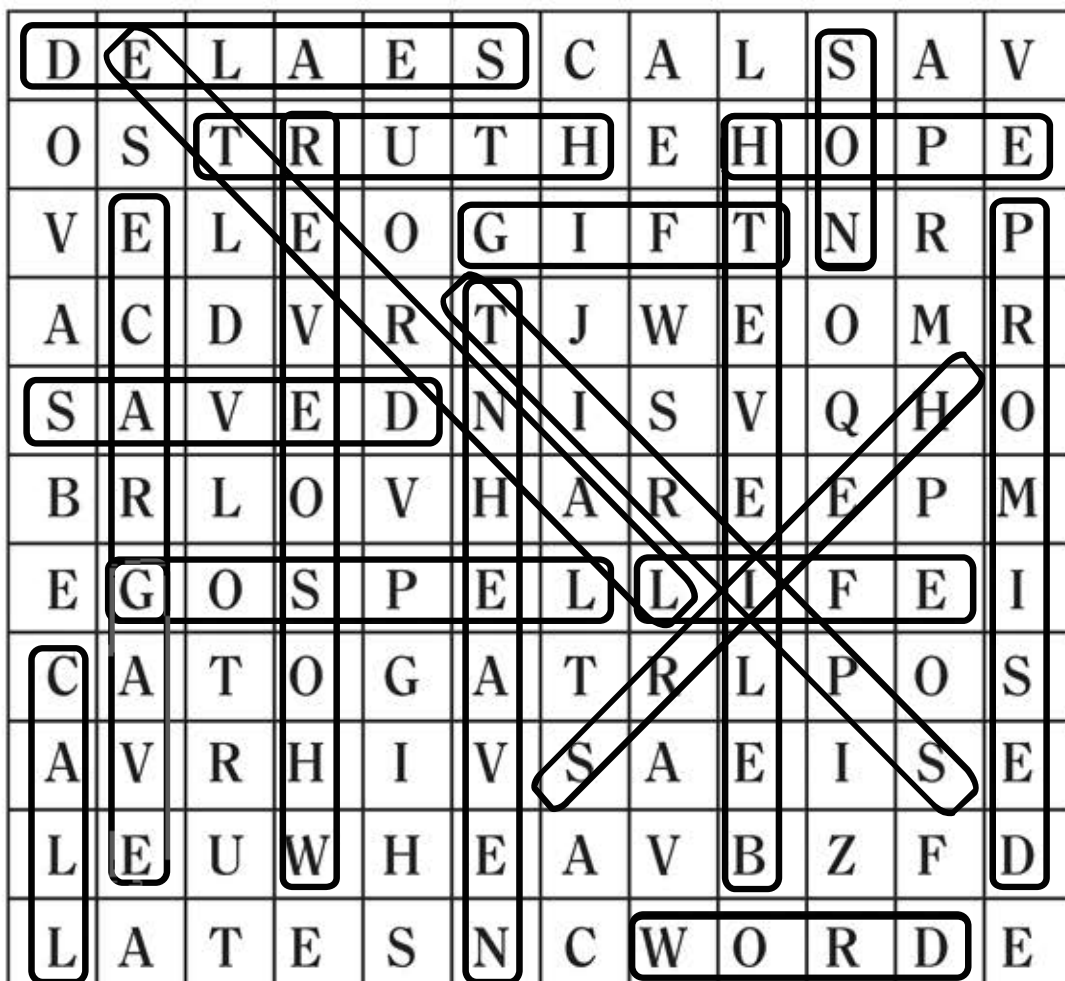

B. The violin is the smallest of the string instruments. There are even very little violins for children. The violin's song can be bright and happy, or it can be sad as a teardrop. Its music can also be light as a feather or soft as a whisper from Princess. When all the violins play together, the music may sound strong as a mighty rushing wind.

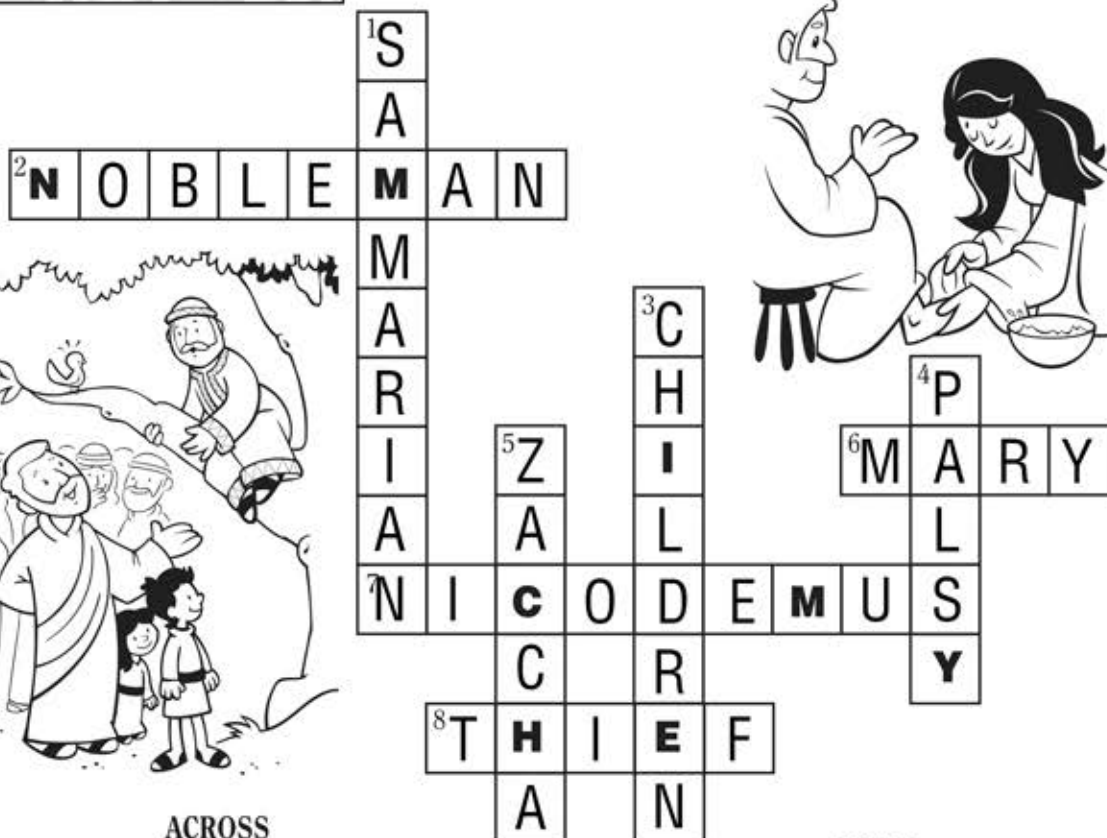

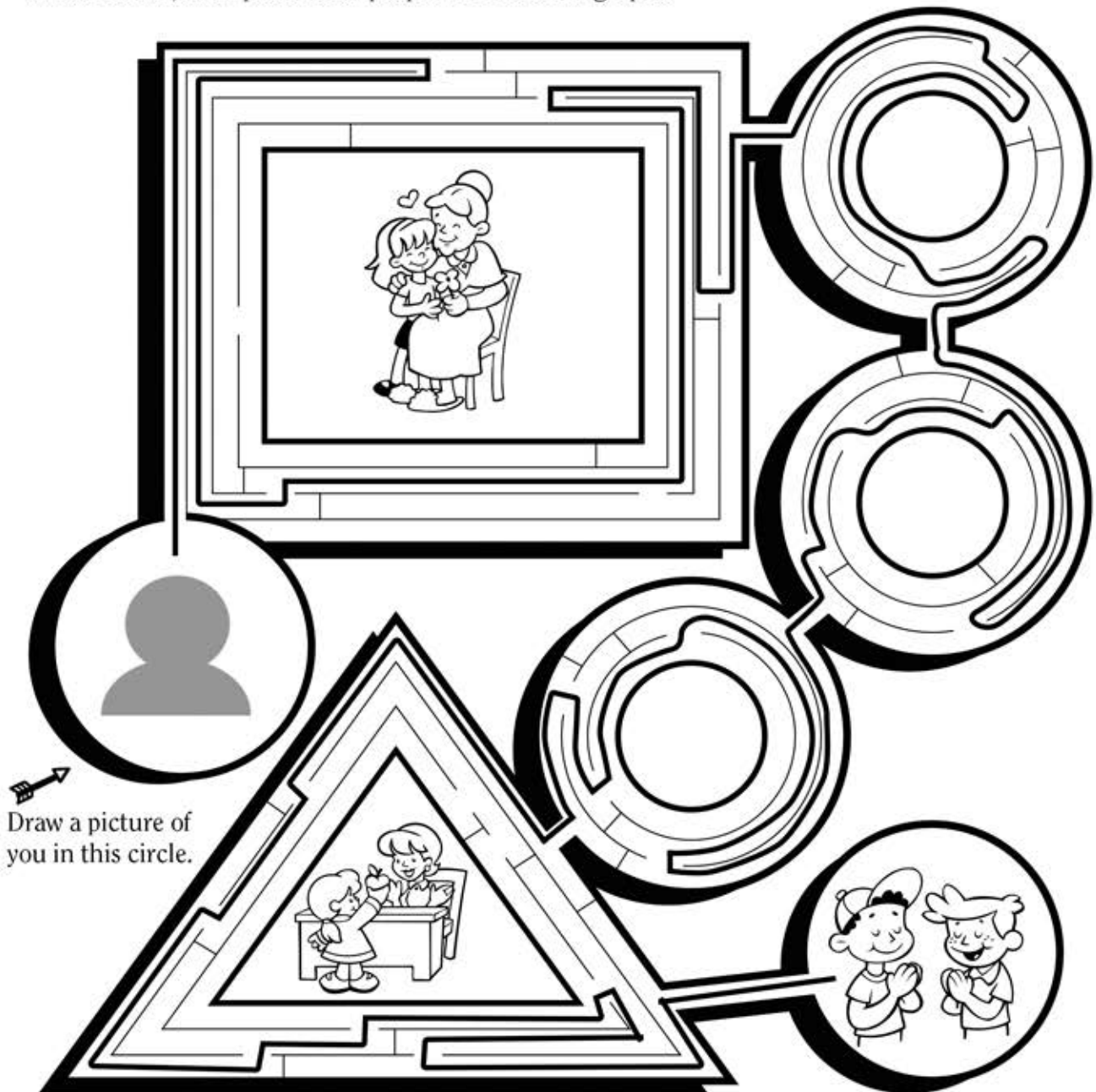
TAKE THE MESSAGE

A FANCIFUL FLUTE

A The flute belongs to the woodwind family. Other woodwind instruments are the piccolo, oboe, bassoon, and clarinet. You blow air into these instruments to play them. At one time, all of the woodwind instruments were made of wood. Today the flute is often made of silver and sometimes even of gold.

B To play the flute, Fahren is holding it sideways. She tightens her lips and blows across the air hole. With practice, she will be able to trill like a bird or play slowly— playing notes as sparkling as a mountain stream. Color little Fahren playing her silver flute.

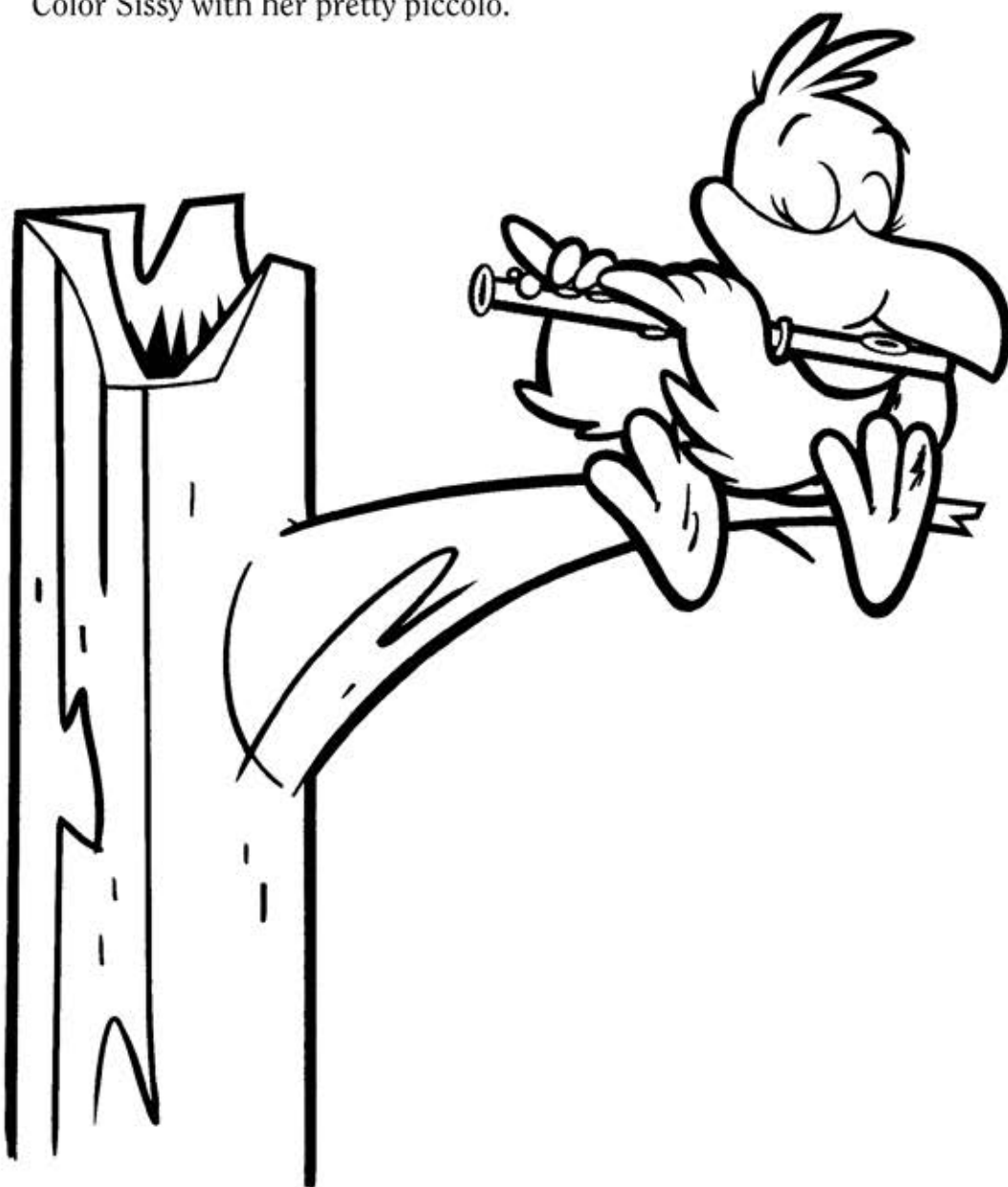

A The awesome oboe has a mouthpiece made of reed. The reed can be fussy and troublesome at times. The player must take very good care of the reed. Sometimes the reed can make the oboe honk like it has a bad cold.

B Usually the oboe is very trustworthy. Sometimes the oboe helps the entire orchestra by playing one single note so all instruments can tune just before the concert begins. THE SUPER SAILOR SAXOPHONE

A The saxophone is called a woodwind instrument, but it is actually made out of brass. There are seven instruments in the family of saxophones. The mouthpiece is very much like the clarinet.

B The saxophone was invented by a man named Adolpho Sax. He lived from 1814 to 1894. He studied flute and clarinet and wanted to improve on the two instruments. With the saxophone he was able to combine the single reed mouthpiece of the clarinet with a redesigned tube. The new shape led to simpler keywork with the fingers, as in playing the oboe. If you listen very carefully when the bassoon is playing, you can hear its little engine chugging along. You can almost see little puffs of smoke billowing out the smoke stack.
